SCHOOL OF DOC

This five-week, intensive, hands-on documentary camp is provided **free** for local public high school students. Students learn all aspects of documentary filmmaking: camera, audio, lighting, and editing, as well as interviewing and producing skills. The final films are presented to a packed theater at the end of the camp in a screening that is free and open to the public.

The following spring, students attend the four-day festival for **free**, screen their film again, see films, and network with filmmakers.

Two students from the group are also chosen to attend an in-residence summer filmmaking intensive the following year at the University of North Carolina School of the Arts.

Full Frame is dedicated to growing the next generation of documentary filmmakers and fans, and diversifying the field through our **free** educational programs:

FELLOWS PROGRAM

Designed to educate, motivate, and nurture university students, the Fellows program brings over 150 students from top film and journalism programs throughout the country to the festival. Students attend a curated slate of screenings, participate in master classes with filmmakers, and make valuable, life-long connections with industry professionals and peers.

TEACH THE TEACHERS

As part of this documentary literacy program for local public school teachers, educational professionals attend the festival for **free**, view and discuss films, and learn to use documentaries in their classrooms to engage and inspire students. Teachers receive educational credit for their work, and Full Frame covers the cost of substitutes while the educators are attending the festival.

LENDING LIBRARY

The **free** Lending Library, housed within Durham Public Schools, allows teachers to check out films and accompanying lesson plans for use in their classrooms. Many of these resources are created by Teach the Teachers participants.

YOUTH SCREENING

This **free** annual screening brings hundreds of local students and teachers to the Carolina Theatre to view a documentary and participate in a Q&A with filmmakers and film subjects. Teachers are provided with study materials to use in the classroom before and after the screening.
